STATE-WIDE SUMMIT

Join us Sunday and Monday before Texas 4-H State Roundup in College Station for the 2025 Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador summit.

1st and 2nd year Ambassadors <u>MUST</u> attend a State-wide Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Summit to continue in the program. 3rd and 4th year Ambassadors are excused from the Summit unless otherwise required by their AgriLife Extension Agent.





Registration will open in May 2025 for all accepted ambassadors.



25-26 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Healthy Texas Youth Ambassadors must meet certain requirements to be considered for selection as an Ambassador. The requirements are as follows:

- Be in at least the 9th grade at beginning of the 2025-26 school year.
- Submit completed application online by April 1, 2025.
- Applicants do not have to be a current member of Texas 4-H, but must agree to become a 4-H member (\$25 annual membership fee due September 1, 2025) if selected to participate in the HTYA program.

25-26 MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

Those selected as a Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador must fulfill the following obligations. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the program.

- Attend the statewide Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Summit. All fees related to this training will be the responsibility of the Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador and/or county program.
- Must be a member in good standing with any other state ambassador programs where membership is held.
- Complete and report 40 hours of leadership, program efforts, or community service annually.
- Attend required continuing education trainings offered face-to-face and/or online.
- Ambassadorship is a 12-month commitment, beginning in June. Ambassadors who fulfill the minimum (40) hours of service will be invited to reapply for the following year.
- Organize at least one community health event during the year with the local Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador team and County Extension Agent.

25-26 ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Healthy Texas Youth Ambassadors must make every effort possible to attend all activities and meetings. If attendance is not possible, notice must be given to the County Extension Agent in charge, in advance, at which time agent(s) will determine if it is an excused absence.

25-26 STATEWIDE SUMMIT

Attendance at the Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador summit **is not** optional for 1st and 2nd year Ambassadors. **No virtual or alternative options offered.**
